

INTRODUCTION

- 3. To be a servant of Jesus you must spend time with Him every day through the word and prayer, and walk in obedience to His Holy Spirit.
- 4. A servant focuses on the needs of others and trusts the master to meet their needs.
- 5. If we truly are a servant our lives will be an example of servant hood, leading others to be servants also.
- 6. The greater the leadership responsibilities we have the more we need to be a servant.
- 7. A servant seeks to bring glory to their master and not to themselves.

LESSON 25

YOUR SERVANT MINISTRY

POINTS TO REMEMBER

BEAR IN MIND!! IT IS NOT YOUR MINISTRY. IT IS GOD'S MINISTRY THROUGH YOU. IT CAN ONLY BE MAINTAINED IN HIS POWER AND WITH HIS HELP.

- 1. SEEK TO DEVELOP A SERVANTS HEART AND ATTITUDE IN ALL YOU DO.
- 2. KEEP FOCUSED ON THE FACT THAT SUCCESS IN LIFE FOR EVERY PERSON IS TO FIND AND DO GOD'S WILL. AT EVERY OPPORTUNITY LET PEOPLE KNOW GOD LOVES THEM AND DIED FOR THEM, AND THAT HE HAS A BEAUTIFUL PLAN FOR THEIR LIFE THROUGH A RELATIONSHIP WITH THE LORD JESUS CHRIST.
- 3. ALWAYS REMEMBER, THAT SPIRITUAL FOOD AND EXERCISE ARE EVEN MORE NECESSARY THAN PHYSICAL FOOD AND EXERCISE. TO FIND AND DO GOD'S WILL A PERSON MUST FEED THEIR SOUL ON THE WORD AND PRAYER DAILY, JUST LIKE THEY NEED PHYSICAL FOOD FOR THEIR PHYSICAL BODY. TO GET THE PROPER SPIRITUAL EXERCISE THEY MUST SEEK TO WALK IN OBEDIENCE TO THE HOLY SPIRIT AT ALL TIMES.
- 4. IF YOU ARE FULL TIME IN MINISTRY, SPEND AT LEAST 2 to 4 HOURS A DAY IN PRAYER AND STUDY OF THE WORD; OTHERWISE, SPEND AT LEAST 30 MINUTES TO AN HOUR.
- 5. KEEP A LIST AND PRAY REGULARLY FOR EVERY MEMBER OF YOUR CHURCH OR MINISTRY; AS WELL AS THE NEEDS OF YOUR MINISTRY, CHURCH, COMMUNITY, MISSIONARIES YOU SUPPORT, THE LOST, ETC.
- 6. READ AT LEAST 3 CHAPTERS A DAY FROM THE BIBLE, SO YOU CAN READ IT THROUGH IN A YEAR. THIS WILL KEEP IT FRESH IN YOUR MIND.
- 7. IF YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR MINISTERING THE WORD, SEEK TO HAVE A MESSAGE THAT SPEAKS TO THE NEEDS OF THE PEOPLE.
 - A. START WITH SCRIPTURE
 - B. ASK QUESTIONS THAT HELP THEM APPLY IT TO THEIR LIVES.
 - C. ASK FOR A DECISION BASED ON WHAT HAS BEEN SHARED.
- 8. LOOK FOR NEEDS THAT ARE NOT BEING MET. ASK GOD TO SHOW YOU HOW YOUR MINISTRY CAN MEET THEM.
- 9. HELP DEVELOP TEAMS OF FAITHFUL WORKERS (PEOPLE WHO ARE DEPENDABLE AND DON'T HAVE TO BE TALKED INTO SERVICE) WHO SHARE GOD'S VISION WITH YOU SO THAT YOU DO NOT HAVE TO DO ALL THE WORK.
- 10. HELP OTHER BELIEVERS MAKE THEIR HOMES HOUSES OF PRAYER AND MINISTRY. THAT

IS, A PLACE WHERE PEOPLE LIVE FOR JESUS, SHARE JESUS, AND HELP OTHERS LIVE FOR JESUS.

- 11. BE A BIG BROTHERS & SISTERS TO NEW CONVERTS BY DISCIPLING THEM. MAKE SURE THEY ARE ESTABLISHED IN THE BASIC BIBLE PRINCIPLES OF PERSONAL LIFE, FAMILY LIFE, CHURCH LIFE, EVANGELISM, AND DISCIPLESHIP.
- 12. BE PART OF A MINISTRY TEAMS THAT EQUIPS THE MATURE SAINTS FOR THE WORK OF THE MINISTRY. (EVANGELISM, DISCIPLESHIP, MUSIC, PRAYER, ETC.)
